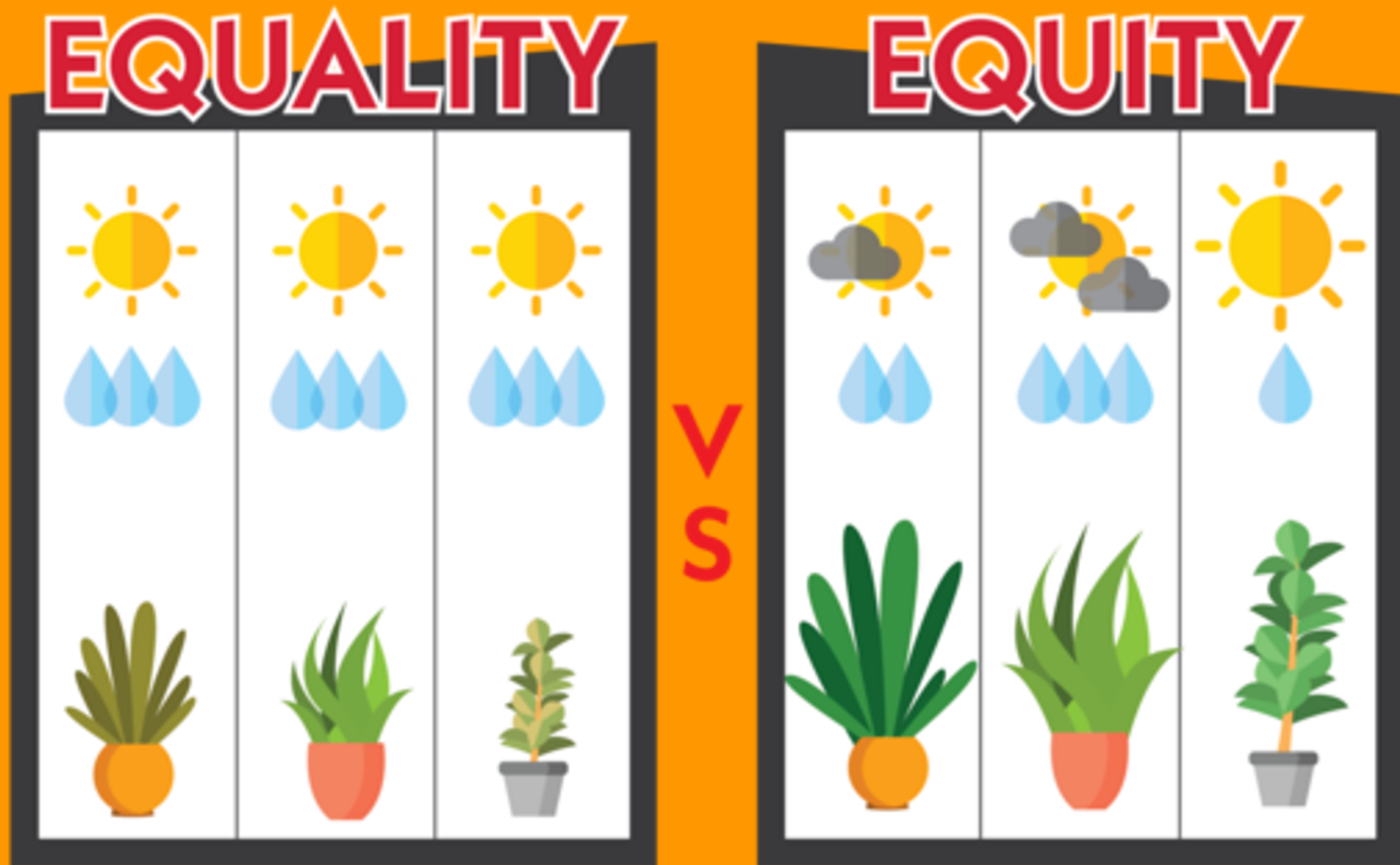

Title I Across the US

- Part of ESSA of 2015 (since 1965)
- Largest federally funded K-12 program
- Focus: equitable educational opportunities to support student success in school communities with greater economic needs

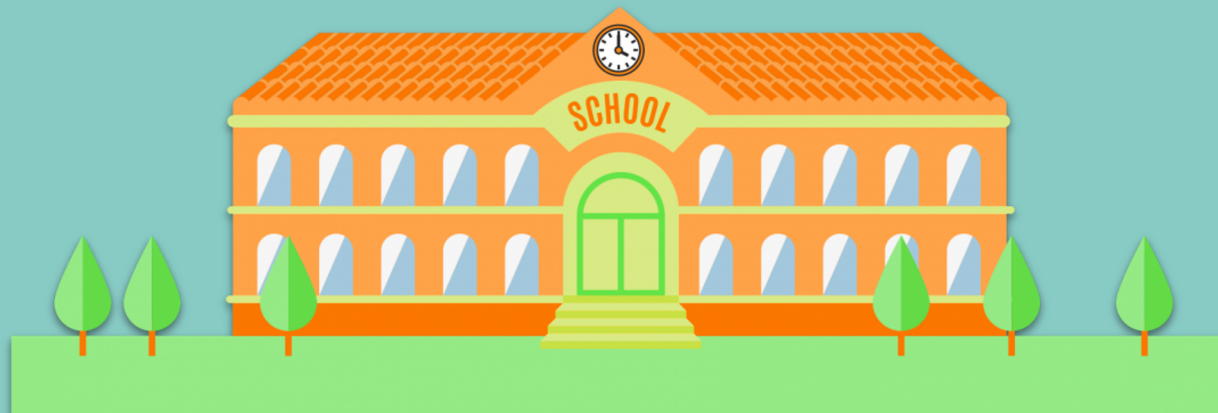


APS Title I Schools

- Eligibility: 45% or more of student population designated as economically disadvantaged
- Funds targeted for early intervention:

8 elementary schools this year:

Abingdon, Barcroft, Barrett, Campbell, Carlin Springs,
Charles Drew, Hoffman-Boston, Randolph



Schoolwide Model



- Focus on school's overall educational program to raise academic achievement for all students
- Greater flexibility to use funding
